Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Faith,

First, I want to thank this community of faith for the affirming and delicious and fun gathering on January 21st where you helped me celebrate my 40th Anniversary of Ordination to the Ministry of Word and Sacrament. As I shared with those present, I cannot imagine a better faith

community to have served 65% of my ministry — right here with you. And I have been deeply blessed and enabled in that service through the love and support of my wonderful husband, Garry. Thank you, one and all, for the kind words, the gifts and the memories!

If you have been hanging around Trinity for a decade or two (or three, as I have) you will recall that one of the joys we have celebrated is our connection with our brothers and sisters in our Manatee County Lutheran Churches. We have built Habitat Houses together, held quarterly healing services at alternating churches, filled Thanksgiving bags for Family Partnership (now Parenting Matters) together, and held many joint youth activities, including sending youth to the National Youth Gathering. Although we have continued to connect through our Mid-Gulf Conference and Synod functions, Covid — and some changes in staffing — brought our "in-person" activities to a stand-still. Now we are seeking to re-connect.

As a first step, Redeemer Lutheran has invited us to join them in a Shrove Tuesday — Fat Tuesday — Pancake Supper served at Redeemer from 4pm-7pm on Tuesday, February 13th. We will have a chance to send some kitchen helpers and provide a portion of the meal. Sign up on the Blue Form to be involved and to partake of the meal. Redeemer's pastoral leader, Dr. Sheri Kling, will introduce us to some cool Taize music, which will be part of our Lenten Journey this year. On Ash Wednesday, and subsequent Wednesdays during Lent, we are invited to participate in Redeemer's mid-day, mid-week Noon worship. After Ash Wednesday, a soup lunch will also follow worship.

Similarly, we are inviting the people of Redeemer to attend our Lenten Worship on Wednesday evenings at 7pm, and to participate in the Soup Supper at 6:15pm and/or the Lenten Study following the 7pm worship. We look forward to restoring past relationships and embarking on new friendships together. Prayerfully, this will simply be the first step in restoring a partnership that can return to blessing our Mana-

tee County ministries and, eventually, connect us again with our other sister congregations as well!

As we prepare to enter the Season of Lent this month, I am delighted to announce that our Faith Formation Team has discovered a new resource that can assist you in your faith journey this Lent — and beyond! We are embracing the capability to design faith formation opportunities that can be accessed online and in-person! This will expand our learning options for individuals and families. Sometimes scheduling prohibits in-person participation. Certainly, daily in-person events are difficult to orchestrate and, even less likely, to attend. However, if you can connect to a study or family faith activity or devotion at any time of the day, EVERYONE can participate on their own schedule!

As we create our Lenten experience offerings, we will make them accessible through our Trinity website: www.TLCbradenton.com, as well as through our worship materials each week. A calendar of study, prayer and giving will be available on Ash Wednesday, as well as the weekend prior to Ash Wednesday.

If you don't see yourself as a "techy" person, never fear! "Old school" remains an option. In-person, face-to-face worship and study and fellowship deeply reflect the love of God made known in the person of Jesus. And as we have learned through pandemic times, connections making online community also have the power to draw us together through the Spirit!

I do hope everyone will have a chance to participate in midweek worship this Lent. I am especially excited about our evening Taize offerings. Taize is a small village in the eastern part of France. Since 1940 it has been the home of an ecumenical community of brothers where prayer, three times a day, is the center of life. Part of that prayer time is spent in singing short repetitive refrains or ostinatos (a repeated pattern). Thousands of people from around the world visit Taize every year. This Lent, we borrow from the tradition of Taize as we offer our prayers and meditations around the cross. At times there will be cantor parts that the congregation is asked to respond to with the repeated refrain. Feel free to sing some, stop and listen, find harmonies, and sing the rounds.

The worship space for Taize is transformed by candlelight. The mood is softly contemplative and there

Get ready for the Karaoke/Lip Sync/Live Music Extravaganza coming up on Saturday, February 3 at Trinity! Immediately after the regular 5:30 p.m. service, we'll get the show started, with music in the sanctuary and tasty food in the fellowship hall. Do you sing or play an instrument? Then you are invited to perform! Or, if you don't want to perform but you enjoy music, then you can come and listen. Friends and neighbors are also most welcome.

You might have noticed this event sounds a bit like the Concert for Hope held at Trinity last March. It is kind of similar! Once again we're gathering to experience the joy of music and let it move us. Some of the feedback I heard after the Concert was that we should do it again, or at least find ways to keep planning music-related experiences. So let's try it out. If enough folks are interested, we can make this sort of event a regular thing.

The earliest Christians clearly felt that music deepened their faith and strengthened their bonds to each other, and they included music in their worship from the beginning. Jesus even sang a hymn with his disciples at the Last Supper (Matt 26:30). In any setting, when we create music together, God finds us. Every note is power.

Chef Darrell's Cooking Class: Tuesday, February 20,

5:30pm. You're invited to learn how to prepare and then enjoy a dinner of Chef's delicious **Potato Crusted Grouper** served over dressed green! Seating is limited so sign up in the Narthex right away. \$20 per person, please. Here's the recipe to serve 4:



Ingredients:

4 C shredded potatoes - fresh or frozen

4 4oz. fillets of Gulf-caught Grouper 4 eggs beaten

4 medium pinches of salt and pepper 8 oz. flour

12 Tb Olive oil blend

4 4 oz. Spring mix tossed with your favorite vinaigrette **Directions:** Pre-heat oven to 400 degrees

Sprinkle both sides of the grouper with salt & pepper, saving some for another step.

Dredge fillets in flour then in the egg wash.

In a 7" nonstick sauté pan add oil and a fillet. Placing pan on medium high heat for 4 minutes on each side. Set aside on a sheet pan. Repeat for all fillets.

Using the same pan, add 1 cup of potatoes, molding to the bottom of the pan using a small spatula. Place fillet on top of potatoes and mold them up and around sides of grouper. Salt and pepper. Cook until brown, flipping fillet. Repeat for all.

Remove creation from stove top and place in the oven for 8-10 minutes.

Remove from oven and place fork in the middle of your grouper. If fork pulls out clean, fish is done.

Serve over dressed greens or place dressed greens on top of your creation. ENJOY!!

PACE provides a safe, supportive environment for girls to build healthy relationships, plan for their future, and overcome histories of trauma. PACE believes that all girls, regardless of background, deserve an opportunity to become strong, compassionate and successful women.

Each year, Trinity partners with PACE through various projects including: serving a Thanksgiving

meal for the students, their families and PACE staff; providing complete take-home Thanksgiving meal bags for students' families; and collecting items in January for the **Pace Corner Cottage.**

F.E.L.T. is dedicated to feeding Manatee County's most needy - homeless and food insecure students - one backpack at a time! Our Lenten project and focus is to aid F.E.L.T. in their Backpack Meal program.

An Elementary school is a place where the first social and community life of a child starts. It becomes a second home for boys and girls, all of whom are naturally curious about the world around them, as well as excited about learning. Unfortunately, there are approximately 3,500 homeless in Manatee County, and many of these are children.

When founded in Manatee County in 2010, F.E.L.T. aided students in three public schools. Today, providing nutritious meals to homeless students is still being fulfilled by their dedicated board, volunteers and community leaders - serving 32 schools and over 1750 homeless and food

insecure children ages 4-18.

Each child in the F.E.L.T. backpack program is pre-qualified by Project Heart, the Manatee School District's Title X Homeless Education Program, providing education-related support services for students who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless.

The F.E.L.T. Backpack program (the first in Manatee County), offers families free groceries for weekends and over school breaks. Food backpacks include healthy, easy-to-prepare food for kid-friendly meals.

Pick up the Lenten calendar of study, prayer and giving that is available in the Narthex beginning Ash Wednesday, February 14th!

Gifts to Trinity's Mission Endowed Fund help it grow to provide more and more investment income we can use to gift ministries in our community.


You can donate to our Mission Endowed Fund at any time of the year. The gifts accrue to grow the principal in
